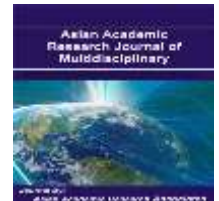

### **Abstract**

William Faulkner Quotes. “Read, read, read. “Never be afraid to raise your voice for honesty and truth and compassion against injustice and lying and greed. “You cannot swim for new horizons until you have courage to lose sight of the shore.” “We must be free not because we claim freedom, but because we practice it.” .... “Dreams have only one owner at a time. That's why dreamers are lonely.....”

Faulkner wrote four more books between 1926 and 1931: Mosquitoes in 1927, Sartoris in 1929, The Sound and the Fury in 1929, and As I Lay Dying in 1930, however none of them sold well, and he earned minimum throughout this period. Sartoris, otherwise called Flags in the Dust, was Faulkner's first book set in the fictional Yoknapatawpha County. The challenge Faulkner confronted getting Flags in the Dust published made him to abandon the publishing process when all is said in done, and he chose to write just for himself. The after effect of this was The Sound and the Fury, the first of Faulkner's legitimately classic novel. The Sound and the Fury was a critically acclaimed novel still not many copies were sold.
